Our Fireworks Tradition:

America Celebrates Freedom

With Duluth's Fourth Fest "postponed" until Labor Day on September 7th (wait, what? We're still calling it Fourth Fest but actually rescheduling to the 7th?), families are planning to celebrate Independence Day this year, well, independently.


The joy of seeing fireworks, a long-time American celebratory tradition, might mean even more to us this difficult year. Off we go to our local retailer to purchase the brightly colored, enticing packages that promise to delight us with all the familiar "oos and ahs" that we remember when life seemed so much simpler.

The American Pyrotechnics Association has a nice article this month that touches on the history of fireworks from the second century B.C. in China. Check it out at https://www.americanpyro.com/history-of-fireworks

They mentioned that most likely the idea of fireworks began when bamboo stalks were thrown into a fire and due to the expanding hollow air pockets they would explode with loud bangs.

It is believed that a mix of potassium nitrate, sulfur and charcoal that resulted in the black power that was the first known gun powder. Apparently the idea of pouring this powder into bamboo sticks to create even louder bangs than the natural phenomenon occurred to someone, eventually followed by the use of paper tubes instead of bamboo.

Europeans began using some version of fireworks in the 13th century, which evolved into use for public celebrations. This tradition followed



the United States. In fact, fireworks were used to celebrate our very first Independence Day upon signing the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776.







founding fathers & drafters of the Declaration, as well as our second President, wrote his wife and trusted advisor Abigail following the signing of the document. He said, "I am apt to believe that [this day] will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival... It ought to be solemnized with bonfires and illuminations from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more." "Illuminations" was the term used for fireworks, and so began the American tradition that came to be a celebration our hard-fought freedom, in the words of the Declaration, our right to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

What Fireworks can I have in MINNESOTA?

"Consumer" fireworks that are allowed:

- Wire or wood sparklers of not more than 100 grams of pyrotechnic composition per item.
- Ground-based sparkling devices which are non-explosive and non-aerial, and contain 75 grams or less of chemical mixture per tube or a total of 500 grams or less for multiple tube items and include:
- fountains, cones, illuminating torches, wheels, ground spinners, flitter sparklers, flash / strobes, and novelty devices including snakes, glow worms, trick noisemakers, party poppers, and snappers.

Age to purchase: 18 years

Fireworks Specifically prohibited:

Firecrackers, torpedoes, missiles, skyrockets, bottle rockets, roman candles, daygo bombs, mines and shells, chasers, and parachutes.

Well that was 244 years ago, and John Adams was absolutely right. Fireworks have been used ever since to mark the birth of a nation that is unlike any other place on earth.

Through wars, depressions, earthquakes, floods, and pandemics, the tradition has continued. In fact, it is especially important to celebrate Independence Day through the difficult times, because when we reflect upon all that we've been through as a country, whether fighting other nations, fighting each other, fighting terror attacks, fighting natural disasters, or fighting disease, one thing is true about America: We're fighters and we fight to win. We *will* get through this difficult year and pull together again, coming through this turbulent time stronger than ever before.

So get those sizzling spinners, fountain cones, snakes and sparklers. Gather your family and celebrate. Reflect with gratitude on the generations before us who sacrificed so that America can stand in freedom, now and forever.
