# Sunspots are Back! With Opportunities to Improve RF Propagation

Our Sun has a great effect on radio frequency propagation as its "exhaust" interacts with Earth's magnetic field. Right now two sunspots have appeared from Solar Cycle 25 that have amateur radio operators excited because the level of sunspot activity has an enormous effect on the ionosphere and as a result, on HF radio propagation conditions.

**Sunspots** are temporary phenomena on the Sun's photosphere that appear as spots darker than the surrounding areas. They are regions of reduced surface temperature caused by concentrations of magnetic field flux that inhibit convection. Sunspots usually appear in pairs of opposite magnetic polarity.

The geomagnetic activity forecast for the period July 31 to August 26 from F.K. Janda, OK1HH:

- Quiet on August 4 7, 15 19, 22 26
- Quiet to unsettled on July 31, August 2 3, (8,) 9, 11, (12 14,) 20
- Quiet to active on (August 1, 10, 21)
- Unsettled to active not expected
- Active to disturbed not expected

Solar wind will intensify on: August 1 - 3(-4, 11 - 15) = 20 - 21, (22 - 25)

For those interested, Tad Cook K7RA of Seattle has a sunspot numbers blog at http://www.wm7d.net/hamradio/solar/k7ra.shtml. He reports that the daily sunspot number was 11 for July 21-27, rising to 22 for July 28-30.







with ultraviolet radiation. Thus they are tied to ionization of the F region. **The daily sunspot number**, when plotted over a month time frame, is very spiky. Averaging the daily sunspot numbers over a month results in the monthly average sunspot number, but it is also rather spiky when plotted. Thus a more averaged, or smoothed, measurement is needed to measure solar cycles. This is the smoothed sunspot number (SSN). The SSN is calculated using six months of data before and six months of data after the desired month, plus the data for the desired month. Because of this amount of smoothing, the official SSN is one-half year behind the current month. Unfortunately this amount of smoothing may mask any short-term unusual solar activity that may enhance propagation.

"Sunspots come and go in an approximate 11-year cycle. The rise to maximum (4 to 5 years) is usually faster than the descent to minimum (6 to 7 years). At and near the maximum of a solar cycle, the increased number of sunspots causes more ultraviolet radiation to impinge on the atmosphere. This results in significantly more F region ionization, allowing the ionosphere to refract higher frequencies (15, 12, 10, and even 6 meters) back to Earth for DX contacts. At and near the minimum between solar cycles, the number of sunspots is so low that higher frequencies go through the ionosphere into space. Commensurate with solar minimum, though, is less absorption and a more stable ionosphere, resulting in the best propagation on the lower frequencies (160 and 80 meters). Thus, in general, high SSNs are best for high-frequency propagation, and low SSNs are best for low -frequency propagation."

There's so much more to learn and experiment with as an amateur radio operator. Educational resources are plentiful on the internet for you to dive into the angle of RF propagation that interests you. Take advantage of any additional free time, if you have it and have fun! \*
