The controller has to be programmed at the sight of the Repeater. Is there an easier, simpler controller that we can use – Randy-KR0B will ask, one without touch-tone, easier to program. Randy-N0BZZ plans to dump the controller in Mahtowa and reprogram it. That could be done at the 94 site. It will be time consuming because of the multi-digit touch-tones. Randy -KR0 doesn't have the time to do it. Down load the manual to study how to do it now. S Com 7 at the main site, S Com 7330 at Mahtowa. Built in basic controller on the Repeater, very basic

Fusion Repeater - strictly digital or analog? If we went strictly digital, that will exclude a lot of people who are analog. Why spend the money for a Fusion if we're never going to use it? It is inevitable we will be going digital, getting ready for the future. Biggest part is that our Repeaters are forty (40) to fifty (50) years old and still working. We have a good plan going. The current Repeaters are reliable and will last for the most part but like all things, they do have an end date Stick the money in it now so that we can get everything works before things crash. There is a complete, spare 94 Repeater, ready to plug it in, at the WDSE Repeater Site. Technology will be improving, just as it has in the past

Thank you for your time and interest.

Air Force MARS membership could be for you. We do hope that it is.

If you have the following interests, and capabilities, we are interested in recruiting you to become an Air Force MARS member. Completion of the following on line training is mandatory: Personally, Identifiable Information (PII) <u>https://iatraining.disa.mil/eta/piiv2/launchPage.htm</u> <u>Cyber Awareness https://iatraining.disa.mil/eta/disa\_cac2018/launchPage.htm</u>

If you have completed: <u>Incident Command System</u> (ICS) -100, 200, 700, and 800 training, and have obtained certification for Air Force MARS or are willing to obtain this training, again, Air Force MARS could be for you.

You must be interested in joining a group of individuals that are dedicated to amateur radio, emergency communications, and willingness to learn and used military communications procedures for voice and digital communications.

You must have equipment that will meet the minimum requirements for voice and digital operation. The equipment will be: transmitter, receiver, (transceiver) modified to operate out of amateur radio bands, computer, modem, and antenna's that are designed to operate on military assigned frequencies. (The best antennas will be a dipole cut to the operational frequency. NVIS antennas work best. You <u>will not</u> need a linear amplifier, however if you have one that will operate on out of amateur radio bands that will be a plus)

You must go through and complete training. You are allowed up to 180 days to do so.

Air Force MARS operation's and procedures are based upon "MARS Operating Instruction", (MOI). The MOI manual uses as its basis for instruction a series of Allied Communications Publications (ACP's), Department of Defense Directives, Department of Defense Instructions, and Department of Defense Manual.

If you already belong to a MARS program and would like to consider Air Force MARS, please contact one of the recruiting team members.




### US Amateur Radio Bands us AMATEUR POWER LIMITS


FCC 97.313 An amateur station must use the minimum transmitter power necessary to carry out the desired communications. (b) No station may transmit with a transmitter power exceeding 1.5 kW PEP.

On March 28, 2017, the Federal Communications Commission adopted rules that will allow Amateur Radio access to 472-479 kHz (830 meters) and to 136.7-137.8 kHz (2.200 meters). However, amateurs cannot use these frequencies until 30 days after the Report and Order is published in the Federal Register and the final procedures for registering stations with the Utilities Telecoms Council (UTC) have been approved and announced. At the time this chart was created, the Report and Order had not been published and the UTC online registration site is not yet available. Follow ARRL, news for further information. New charts will be published at www.arri.org/graphical-frequency-allocations when the bands are fully available for use.







ATTENTION MEMBERS: URGENT CALL TO ACTION!

As you may have heard, the FCC has made a proposal to add service fees on Amateur Radio transactions. Please read the detail below and go to <a href="https://www.fcc.gov/ecfs/filings">https://www.fcc.gov/ecfs/filings</a> to express your opposition to this Proposal during the official comment period.

### FCC Proposes to Reinstate Amateur Radio Service Fees

### 08/28/2020 [UPDATED 2020-09-01 @1845 UTC]

Amateur radio licensees would pay a \$50 fee for each amateur radio license application if the FCC adopts rules it proposed this week. Included in the FCC's fee proposal are applications for new licenses, renewal and upgrades to existing licenses, and vanity call sign requests. Excluded are applications for administrative updates, such as changes of address, and annual regulatory fees.

The FCC proposal is contained in a *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* (*NPRM*) in MD Docket **20-270**, which was adopted to implement portions of the "Repack Airwaves Yielding Better Access for Users of Modern Services Act" of 2018 — the so-called "**Ray Baum's Act**."

The Act requires that the FCC switch from a Congressionally-mandated fee structure to a costbased system of assessment. In its *NPRM*, the FCC proposed application fees for a broad range of services that use the FCC's Universal Licensing System (ULS), including the Amateur Radio Service that had been excluded by an earlier statute. The 2018 statute excludes the Amateur Service from annual regulatory fees, but not from application fees.

"[A]pplications for personal licenses are mostly automated and do not have individualized staff costs for data input or review," the FCC said in its *NPRM*. "For these automated processes — new/major modifications, renewal, and minor modifications — we propose a nominal application fee of \$50 due to automating the processes, routine ULS maintenance, and limited instances where staff input is required."

The same \$50 fee would apply to all Amateur Service applications, including those for vanity call signs. "Although there is currently no fee for vanity call signs in the Amateur Radio Service, we find that such applications impose similar costs in aggregate on Commission resources as new applications and therefore propose a \$50 fee," the FCC said.

The FCC is not proposing to charge for administrative updates, such as mailing address changes for amateur applications, and amateur radio will remain exempt from annual regulatory fees. "For administrative updates [and] modifications, which also are highly automated, we find that it is in the public interest to encourage licensees to update their [own] information without a charge," the FCC said.

The FCC also proposes to assess a \$50 fee for individuals who want a printed copy of their license. "The Commission has proposed to eliminate these services — but to the extent the Commission does not do so, we propose a fee of \$50 to cover the costs of these services," the FCC said.

The Ray Baum's Act does not exempt filing fees in the Amateur Radio Service. The FCC dropped assessment of fees for vanity call signs several years ago.




